Admission Requirements

To be admitted to this program, you should be entering your junior or senior year in high school and have a genuine interest in any of the aspects of natural resource management. You should be willing to work on a team and you must have a C (2.0) or higher GPA.

A Word to Teachers and Guidance Counselors

Many high school students have the curiosity to become scientists but never have the opportunity to develop those interests. You may know students who would qualify for this program and would have a sincere interest in participating. This program has also been a successful "stepping stone" for Envirothon competition. Please pass this information along to them. It could make all the difference in their future.

How to Apply

Complete the attached application. Include a letter of recommendation from your high school teacher, guidance counselor or principal and a non-refundable check or money order for \$50.

Deadline: April 28, 2023

Fees: The total fee for the Kentucky Forest Leadership Program is \$500 (including the \$50 non-refundable application fee). This amount covers all programming costs and room and meals.

Acceptance: Enrollment is limited. Up to two applications per county will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. The absolute deadline is April 28, but get your application in early so you will have a better chance of getting your first option. If you are admitted to the program, you will be sent maps and lists of materials necessary for the program. - Wildlife students enrolled in this option will gain experience with different techniques to sample, identify and manage wildlife as well as conducting species diversity and population surveys in various Kentucky habitats.
